A local environmental group has brought to the City's attention that a small colony of Snowy Plovers (*Charadrius nivosus*) has been discovered nesting on the future site of the Salinas Public Safety Center. This coastal bird is a federally-listed Threatened species and has protected habitat in the nearby Salinas River National Wildlife Refuge, about 10 miles away from the site. The Snowy Plovers nest on the open bare ground of a beach or inland flat, potentially explaining their interest in the large open site of this project. Safe relocation of the colony back to the Wildlife Refuge cannot occur without:


- 1) Securing approval from the Environmental Protection Agency
- 2) Waiting a minimum of 60 days after the confirmed final nest hatchings of the colony.

Deliverables:

 Identify the potential project impacts and provide a mitigation plan for any of these impacts caused by the discovery of the Threatened Snowy Plovers onsite.
